The Goal

The goal of the Visions Hanover Project is to raise funds to help provide permanent, supported housing for 12 individuals with developmental and other disabilities on the South Park Street site of Outreach House. The building will include: six studio, two 2-bedroom, and one 3-bedroom apartments; a large kitchen & dining room for family-style dinners; space for administrative offices; and accommodations for overnight staffing.




Our Vision for Supported Housing

Why Hanover?



Since its opening in 2014 in Enfield, the Visions model has been so successful that Visions has been overwhelmed with requests for housing. This prompted the purchase of a second property on Green

Street in downtown Lebanon in 2020, where 11 individuals took up residence in August of 2021.

Meanwhile, in 2019, when Outreach House closed their doors and gifted their property to us, we seized on the opportunity it presented! Their generosity has allowed us to plan for our expansion into a third location—in the heart of Hanover where we will serve an additional 12 individuals with customized, wrap-around support services.



The property's downtown location is ideal: it's within walking distance of public transport-tation, Main Street shops, Dartmouth College, churches, the Library, and the Co-op.

Outreach House History

Outreach House, a nonprofit offering supported housing for seniors, opened its doors at 11 South Park Street in April of 1997, thanks to the volunteer efforts of Ann James, Reverend Donald MacKenzie, and several other members of the Church of Christ at Dartmouth College. Longtime Hanover residents and Dartmouth alumni may remember the property's past incarnation as home to the Blue Spruce Inn, a boarding residence which often hosted visitors attending Dartmouth College events, and later as the home and office of Dr. Hugh MacNamee, a respected child psychiatrist, and his wife Mimi and family.

In June of 2019, Outreach House donated the property to Visions to sustain its mission of supported housing for an underserved population. We are grateful!
